Reward Systems

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole school program that **actively promotes positive behaviour**. It enables students to develop a clear understanding of required expectations, become responsible for the own behaviour and work together to create a positive, productive and harmonious learning community. Out school-wide expectations are represented with an **owl mascot** named **Boobook** and the core values of **Respect**, **Responsibility and Pride**.

Listed below are some of the way positive behaviour is recognised within our school.

Gotcha Cards

'Gotcha' cards are given to any student displaying Respect, Responsibility and Pride in both social and academic areas.

When children receive a 'Gotcha' teachers:

- 1. Fill in the card
- 2. Sign the back
- 3. Sign off on 'Gotcha' Register
- 4. Give to student to take card home

Good News Note

A more specific 'note' sent home to inform parents/ carers of positive behaviours. These are also not limited and can include both social and academic aspects.

Assembly Points

Daily class points are awarded to the class displaying core values during morning, lunch and recess assembly by duty staff. Winning class for the fortnight sits to seats during fortnightly assemblies.

Round Gotcha Tokens

These are given out in the playground and during assemblies. School leaders also hand these out to students. Students will exchange these tokens with their teacher for a 'Gotcha' card.
